

HS/EHS children/pregnant women with a primary language other than English: **14%** (293)



Family Services

- 95% (1,717) of HS/EHS families received at least one family service from their program in addition to enrollment.
- 223 (12%) of HS/EHS families experienced homelessness, and of these, 94 (42%) found housing.

HS 18% (283) EHS 13% (118) left during the program year


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HS 68% (191) EHS 55% (65) of those vacancies were filled during the program year

Disabilities, Mental Health

- 17% of HS children had IEPs.
- 17% of EHS children had IFSPs.
- 19% of HS children & 26% of EHS children had a mental health professional consult with their program staff;
 40% (HS) / 45% (EHS) of those children had 3 or more of these consultations.
- 3% of HS & 1% of EHS children received an individual mental health assessment in their program.
- 10% of HS & 13% of EHS children received referrals for outside MH services;
 67% (HS) / 60% (EHS) of those children received those services.
