Executive Summary

The University of New Hampshire Survey Center included two questions on its January 2024 Granite State Poll for the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services to better understand New Hampshire residents' feelings about climate change and air pollution. One thousand, eight hundred, and sixty-four (1,864) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between January 4 and January 8, 2024. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.3 percent.

The following figures display survey results, detailed tabular results may be found in Appendix A and Appendix B contains the survey instrument. Due to rounding, percentages may not add to 100%.

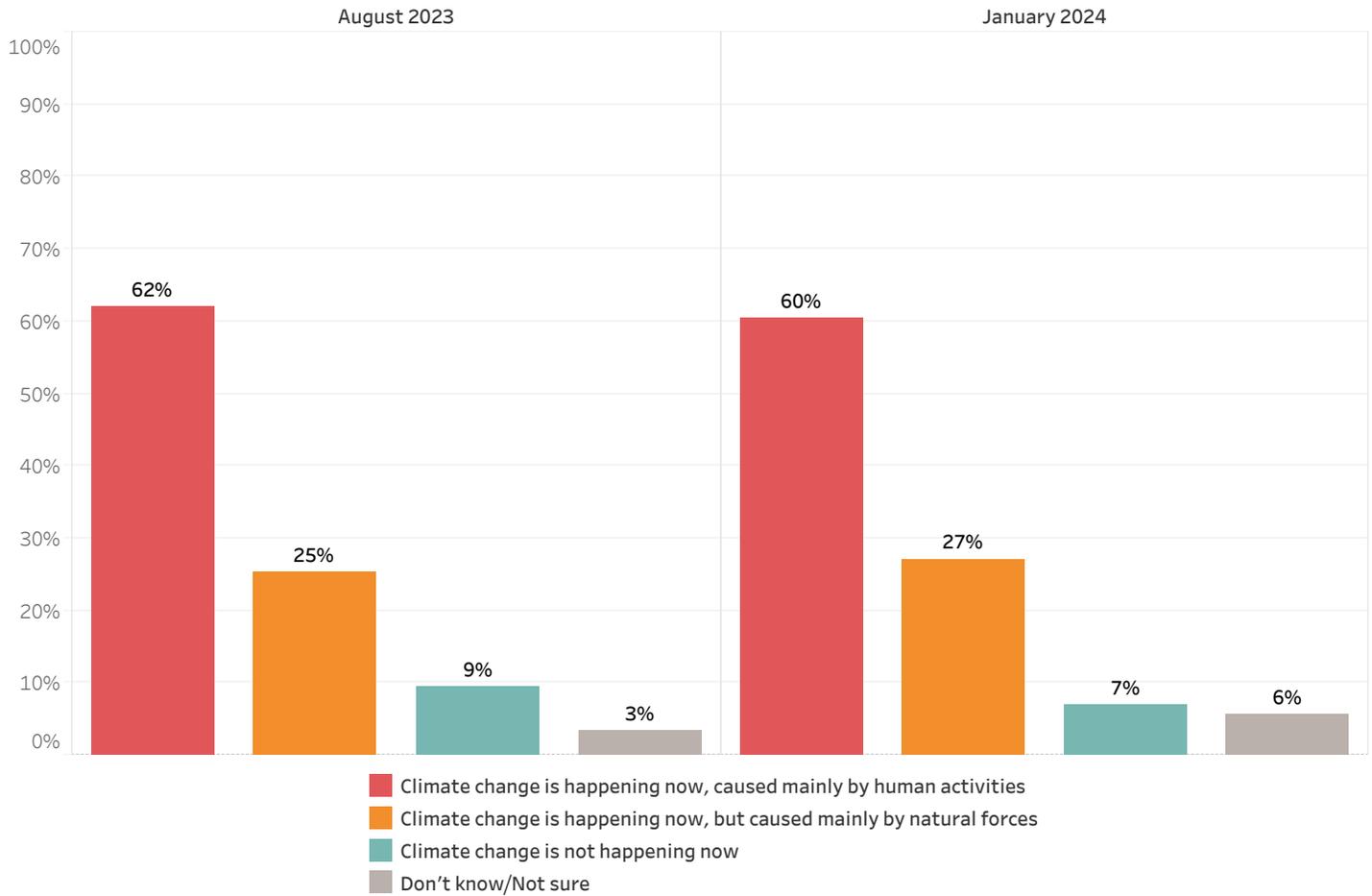
Key Findings

Six in ten New Hampshire residents feel that climate change is happening now and is caused mainly by human activities; left-leaning Granite Staters and those with a college degree or more education are most likely to believe this to be true. Just over a quarter of state residents, particularly libertarians and conservatives, feel climate change is happening now but is caused mainly by natural forces, while less than one in ten feel that climate change is not happening now.

Just over half of Granite Staters think it should be a very high or high priority for New Hampshire to reduce air pollution to address climate change, including most who believe climate change is happening and caused mainly by humans. Just over a quarter think reducing air pollution should be a low or very low priority for the state, including a majority of those who believe climate change is happening but caused mostly by natural forces and nearly all of those who believe climate change is not happening now. Young people and those with high levels of education are particularly likely to think reducing air pollution should be a very high or high priority.

Six in ten (60%) New Hampshire residents believe climate change is happening now, caused mainly by human activities, 27% believe climate change is happening now, but is caused mainly by natural forces, 7% believe climate change is not happening now, and 6% don't know or are unsure. Results are broadly similar to those in August 2023.

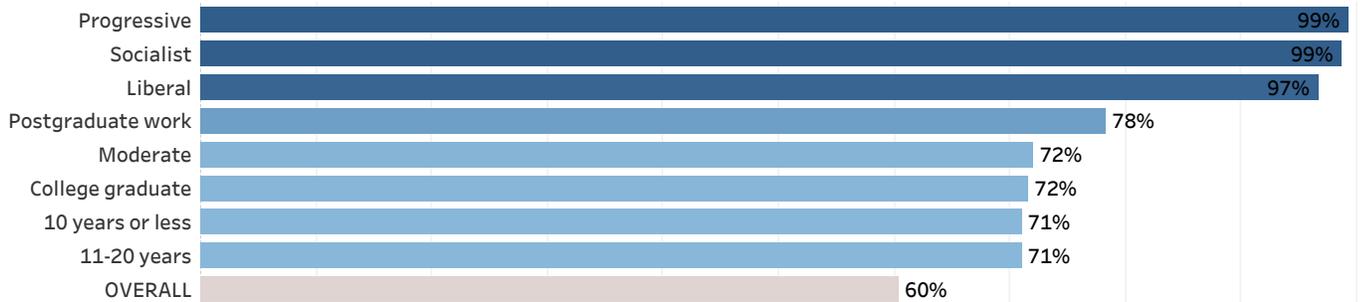
Figure 1a: Which of the following three statements do you think is more accurate?



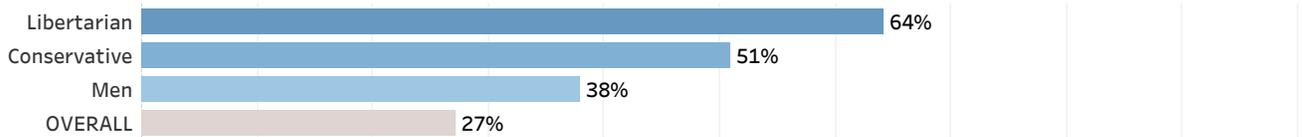
- Self-described progressives, socialists, liberals, and moderates, those with a college degree or more education, and those who have lived in New Hampshire for 20 years or less are more likely than others to believe that climate change is happening now, caused mainly by human activities.
- Self-described libertarians and conservatives and men are more likely than others to believe that climate change is happening now, but caused mainly by natural forces.
- Self-described conservatives are more likely than others to believe climate change is not happening now.

Figure 1b: Closest Opinion on Climate Change - By Demographics

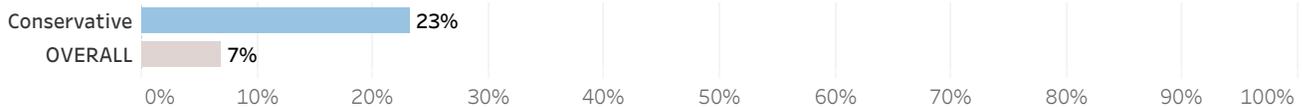
Climate change is happening now, caused mainly by human activities



Climate change is happening now, but caused mainly by natural forces

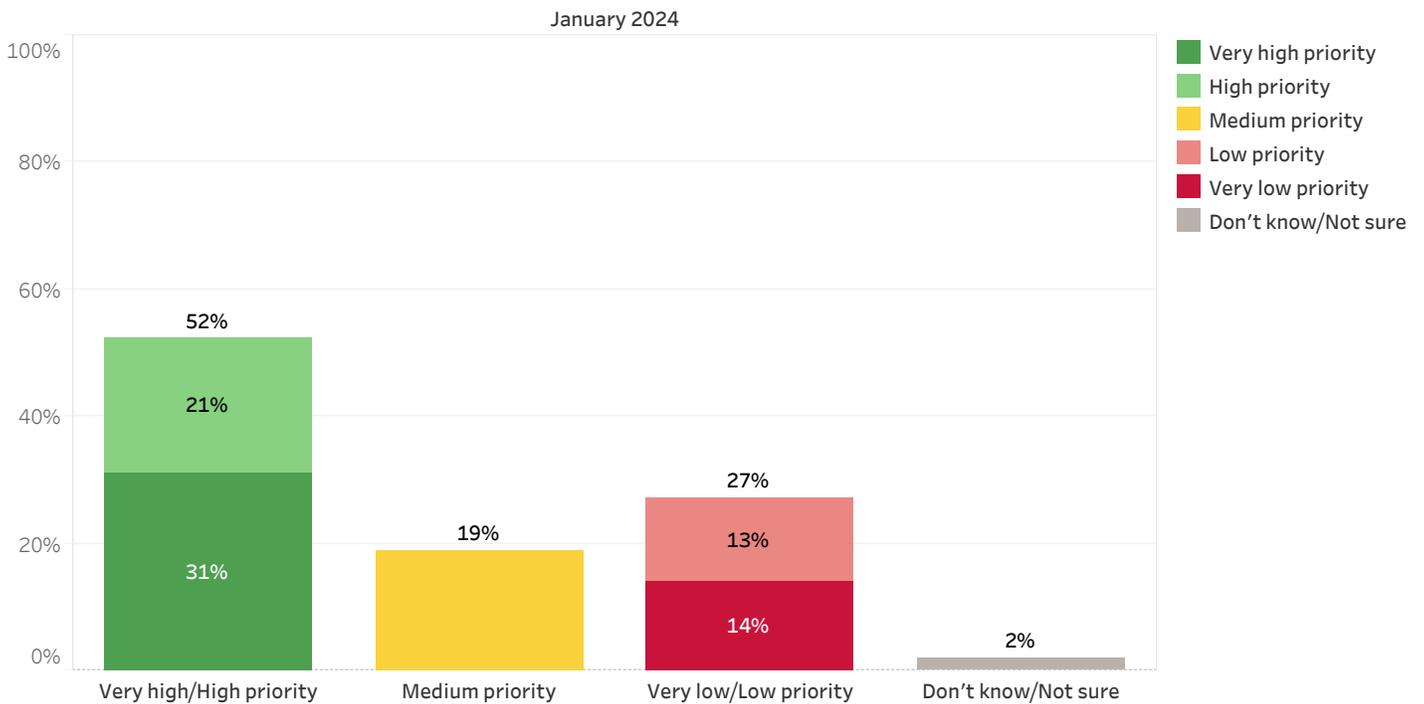


Climate change is not happening now



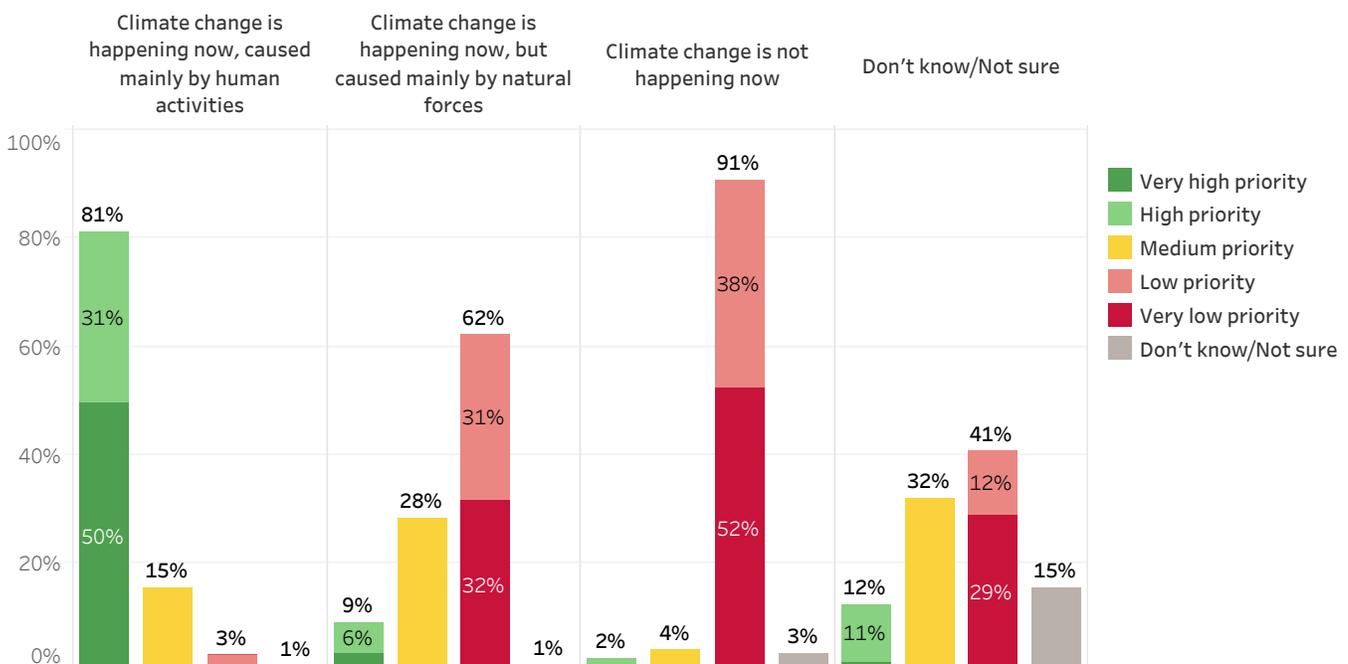
Just over half (52%) of New Hampshire residents think it should be a very high (31%) or high (21%) priority for New Hampshire to reduce air pollution in order to help address climate change, 19% think it should be a medium priority, 27% think it should be a low (13%) or very low (14%) priority, and 2% don't know or are unsure.

Among those who believe climate change is happening now, caused mainly by human activities (N=1,121), 81% think it should be a very high or high priority for New Hampshire to reduce air pollution. By contrast, among those who think climate change is happening but is caused mainly by natural forces (N=504), 62% think it should be a low or very low priority to reduce air pollution and 91% of those who think climate change is not happening now (N=128) think it should be a very low or low priority.

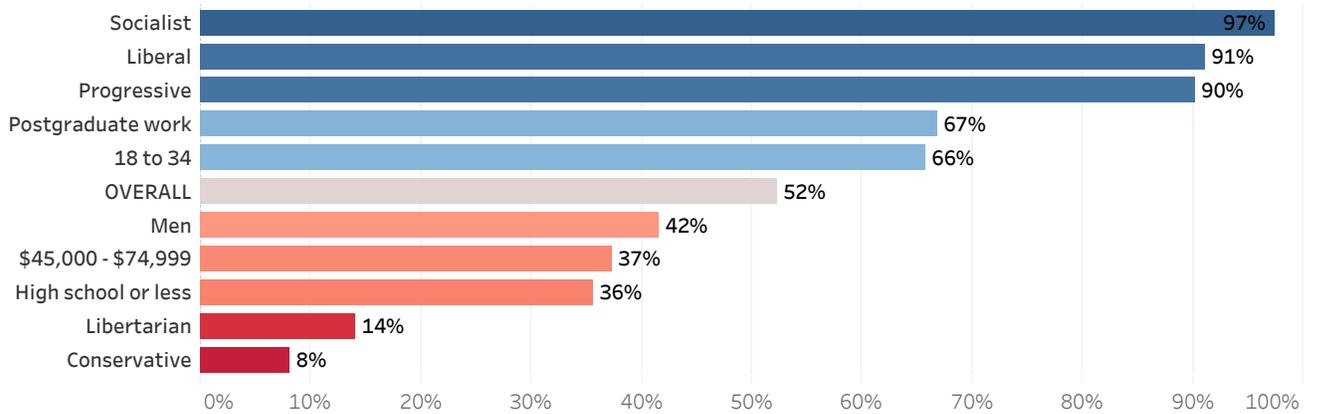
Figure 2b: How much of a priority do you think it should be for New Hampshire to reduce air pollution in order to help address climate change? - by Closest Opinion on Climate Change



Self-described socialists, liberals, and progressives, those who have completed postgraduate work, and those aged 18 to 34 are more likely than others to think it should be a very high or high priority for New Hampshire to reduce air pollution in order to help address climate change. Self-described conservatives and libertarians, those with a high school education or less, those with a household income between \$45,000 and \$74,999, and men are less likely to feel this way.

Technical Report

How the Sample Was Selected

The January 2024 Granite State Poll survey was a web-based survey of Granite State Panel members who are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire. The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Respondents to the Granite State Poll were asked if they wished to participate in further research and asked to provide an email address. Those who agreed and provided an email address were added to the panel. Panel members were also recruited by texting a random sample of cellular telephones in the state and inviting the recipient to take a short survey. At the conclusion of the survey, recipients were asked if they would like to join the panel and provide an email address. Respondents under the age of 18, non-New Hampshire residents, and seasonal residents who are not registered to vote in New Hampshire were excluded from this survey and did not receive an invitation to join the panel. For each survey which they complete, panel members are entered into quarterly drawings to earn rewards, such as gift certificates from statewide and internet companies.

When Data Was Collected

An invitation email was sent to Granite State Panel members on January 4th, 2024. Two email reminders were sent to non-responders and the survey was completely closed on the morning of January 8th. One thousand, eight hundred sixty-four (1,864) Granite State Panel members completed the survey. The response rate for the January 2024 Granite State Poll is 34%.

Weighting of Data

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.

Sampling Error

The Granite State Poll, like all surveys, is subject to sampling error due to the fact that all residents in the area were not interviewed. For those questions asked of five hundred (500) or so respondents, the error is +/-4.4%. For those questions where fewer than 500 persons responded, the sampling error can be calculated as follows:

$$\text{Sampling Error} = \pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{P(1 - P)}{N}}$$

Where P is the percentage of responses in the answer category being evaluated and N is the total number of persons answering the particular question.

For example, suppose you had the following distribution of answers to the question, "Should the state spend more money on road repair even if that means higher taxes?" Assume 1,000 respondents answered the question as follows:

YES	47%
NO	48%
DON'T KNOW	5%

The sampling error for the "YES" percentage of 47% would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{47(53)}{1000}} = \pm 3.1\%$$

for the "NO" percentage of 48% it would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{48(52)}{1000}} = \pm 3.1\%$$

and for the "DON'T KNOW" percentage of 5% it would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{5(95)}{1000}} = \pm 1.4\%$$

In this case we would expect the true population figures to be within the following ranges:

YES	43.9% - 50.1% (i.e., 47% ±3.1%)
NO	44.9% - 51.1% (i.e., 48% ±3.1%)
DON'T KNOW	3.6% - 6.4% (i.e., 5% ±1.4%)

The margin of sampling error for the January 2024 Granite State Poll is +/-2.3 percent.

Design Effect

These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 2.2%.
